Health Studies Program Independent Research Course Proposal



The Health Studies Program at University College at the University of Toronto is a multidisciplinary undergraduate program of critical studies in the determinants of health and health care. One fundamental aspect of the Health Studies Program is its strong emphasis on research. Our students are strongly encouraged to complete at least one independent research course as part of their program of study.

To enroll in an independent research course, each student is responsible for finding an appropriate supervisor. The supervisor <u>must</u> be a faculty member with an appointment in an academic unit at the University of Toronto. (NB - sessional instructors are not eligible to supervise independent study courses unless they hold an appointment in a U of T academic unit, but MAY be eligible to supervise a HST400Y Practicum course – please see the *Practicum Guide* for details). Both the supervisor and the Health Studies Program Director must sign off on the contract; you will not be enrolled in the course until it has been approved by the Program. Complete this form with your supervisor and the Program Director before submitting to the Office of Academic Services (UC 173).

Most independent research courses will include assignments that correspond to the building blocks of the project (e.g., research proposal, literature review, proposed methodology and/or ethics protocol) as well as a draft and final version of a research report. In addition, all independent research course participants are expected to present at a poster at the University College Research and Practice Fair, and to give an oral presentation at the Health Studies Symposium, and so a component of the grade should be allocated to these tasks. Up to 20% of the course grade can be allocated to participation. Please see the *Independent Research Course Guidelines for Students and Supervisors* for more details.

^{**} All course work must be submitted for grading by the last day of classes (before exams). Requests for extensions on course work must be made to the instructor as far prior to the deadline as is possible, and require supporting documentation.
