Considerations such as validity, generalizability, and representativeness of data will be addressed. Topics may include experimental, comparative, and epidemiological approaches.

Relevant Criterion: Previous experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position.

Description of Duties: Meeting with instructor, responding to student inquiries and marking papers and tests. The position may also include attending some lectures. Duties of this position shall be performed at the campus on which the position is located.
