**SDS377H1 – Lesbian Studies**

This multidisciplinary course will examine multiple lesbian identities that have varied in time and place. The course will pose such questions as: What does “lesbian” mean? Why have changes occurred in the meaning? How has lesbian identity been culturally represented and politically expressed in various social and political contexts? It will also take up contemporary theoretical, cultural, and political understandings of lesbianism.

*NOTE: This course will focus on lesbian and gender-related issues, and may also extend to a consideration of female sexuality more broadly, of bisexuality, intersexuality and transsexuality.*
