**SDS378H1 – Queer Youth Studies**

Recent educational debates concerning sex education, queer visibility, and supports for queer and questioning students continue to produce mixed responses in schools and communities. Using academic research, personal essays, and visual and performing arts, this course will explore questions about queer youth identity and culture; the current state of sex and gender within school curricula; social justice pedagogies related to sexual and gender diversity; and other related concerns. Issues of race, ethnicity, class, and religion, and how these inform and impact queer youth cultures will also be considered through an intersectional and queer youth of colour framework.
