SDS381H1 –Intro to Trans Studies

This introductory course engages students with contemporary research on transgender issues from intersectional, trans/national and critical race perspectives. Students will become familiar with related resources, academic research, conceptual frameworks and political approaches to trans issues. It explores legal, cultural and social issues & politics, mainstream and other media representations (including films, interviews, and other genres), as well as current and historical advocacy and community work, particularly in relation to power structures such as post-colonialism and globalization, the nation-state, race, immigration, disability and sexuality.
