SDS470H1 – Sexual Aesthetics/Sexual Representations

This course explores the history, culture, and aesthetics of sexual representations. Is there a difference between erotica and pornography? How do debates about artistic merit and censorship relate to larger issues of power, capitalism, and technology? How are sexual desires and identities increasingly shaped around those sexual representations? With these questions in mind, students will engage with literature on sexuality and its intersections with theories of representation, aesthetics and performance.
